PRACTICE DIRECTION

HEARING & GRANT OF ADJOURNMENT

Hon'ble the Chief Justice has been pleased to issue the following practice directions:-

- 1. Ordinarily, in any matter, Courts may not allow more than one pass over.
- 2. While referring a case to Registrar / Joint Registrar for completion of pleadings, the case may be adjourned by the Court to a fixed date and the Registrar / Joint Registrar shall fix interim dates to ensure that pleadings are complete before the date so fixed by the Court.
 - In order to avoid further adjournment by the Court, the Advocates concerned shall ensure that steps for completion of pleadings are taken as per dates given by the Registrar/Joint Registrar.
- 3. The Court may, in a case not older than 5 years, entertain a request for adjournment by submission of an adjournment slip, duly signed by advocates of all the parties in a particular case.
 - In the cases older than 5 years, however, adjournment may be granted by making a special mention before the Court at least a day prior to the date of hearing with advance notice to the other party(s) and agreed to by counsel for both parties.
- 4. The Court may, in their discretion, for keeping a check on unnecessary/avoidable adjournments & filing of frivolous applications and to have deterrent effect, impose reasonable/realistic cost and the cost so imposed may, ordinarily, be paid to the opposite party.

The Practice Directions shall come into force w.e.f. 2nd Feb. 2009.
